


# > WARM HOSPITALITY

# > DHIDO

Dhido is a traditional Nepali dish made from buckwheat, corn or millet flour. It is a thick, sticky porridge-like dish usually served with vegetables, lentils, or meat dishes



# > NEWARI CUISINE

Newari cuisine, native to the Newar community in the Kathmandu Valley, is renowned for its rich and diverse flavors. It includes dishes like "Yomari" (a sweet rice flour dumpling filled with jaggery and sesame seeds), "Chatamari" (Nepalese pizza), "Bara" (lentil patties), and "Wo" (a spicy lentil doughnut). # > SEL ROTI

Sel Roti is a traditional Nepali rice-based donut or ring-shaped bread made during festive occasions like Dashain and Tihar. It is crispy on the outside and soft on the inside, with a slightly sweet flavor.

Established in 1973, the park boasts a wide array of flora and fauna, including the one-horned rhinoceros, Bengal tiger, Asian elephant, and gharial crocodile. Wildlife safaris via elephant rides, jeep tours, walking excursions, and canoe rides provide unparalleled opportunities to observe animals in their natural habitat. Birdwatchers can delight in spotting over 500 bird species. Additionally, visitors can immerse themselves in the rich Tharu culture. Chitwan's conservation efforts have contributed to the preservation of endangered species. Accessible from major cities like Kathmandu and Pokhara, the park's best time to visit is during the dry season (October to March). As a protected area, responsible tourism practices are encouraged to maintain the park's natural splendor and ecological balance, offering a remarkable experience connecting travelers with nature and wildlife while exploring Nepal's cultural heritage.



#### Day 1: Arrive Kathmandu

Arrival at Kathmandu airport. Upon arrival, meet, assist and transfer to the hotel. Rest of the day at leisure. Overnight at Kathmandu Hotel.

#### Day 2: Kathmandu Sightseeing

Kathmandu, the capital city of Nepal, is rich in culture, history, and ancient architecture. There are numerous sightseeing spots worth visiting to immerse yourself in the city's heritage. We will visit Syambhunath Stupa, Pashupatinath Temple, The Durbar Squares and Thamel Market.



#### Day 3: Kathmandu to Chitwan Drive/Flight

Morning drive or opt out for flight for the transfer to Chitwan. Reaching upon Chitwan, check in and you can proceed to visit the Elephant Breeding centre, the Chitwan Museum for the knowledge of wildlife and engage in the Tharu Cultural show by the local community

#### Day 4: Chitwan Safari Day

This day is full of wildlife exploration, you can choose from Jeep safari, Elephant Back ride, Jungle walk or Canoe safari or try all of them in a Single day. One horned Rhinos, deer's, gharials are easily spotted and if you are lucky then you can have the view of majestic Bengal Tigers in the National Park.

#### Day 5: Chitwan to Kathmandu Flight/Drive

This day you can go for bird watching in the morning and take a flight or drive back to Kathmandu or add other cities like Pokhara, Lumbini or Bandipur for Extending your stays in Nepal



#### Annapurna Conservation Area Project

Area: Over 7,600 square kilometers

Location: Predominantly in Gandaki Pradesh (Province No. 4) and parts of Province No. 5. Includes districts like Manang, Mustang, Kaski, Myagdi, and Lamjung.

Climate: From subtropical to alpine, offering diverse weather conditions based on altitude and season.

Attractions: Rich biodiversity, stunning landscapes, cultural diversity, trekking routes (e.g., Annapurna Circuit, Annapurna Base Camp), and mountain vistas.

Accommodations: A range of accommodations available, from basic lodges to more luxurious options, in towns and villages along trekking routes.

Best Places: Annapurna Base Camp, Ghorepani Poon Hill, Manang, Mustang, Jomsom, and Tilicho Lake.

Best Season to Visit: Autumn (September to November) and Spring (March to May) for clear skies, pleasant weather, and optimal trekking conditions.

#### Day 1: Arrive Kathmandu

#### Day 3: Kathmandu to Pokhara Drive/Flight

Kathmandu to Pokhara drive will take around 8 hrs and 25 minutes of flight time from Kathmandu. You get to explore out the city if you arrive early and prepare for the trek the next day.

Day 4: Drive to Siwai and Hike to Bamboo via Chomrong (2300 M)

Day 5: Bamboo to Deurali Hike (3200 M)

Day 6: Deurali to Annapurna Base camp (4130 M)

Day 7: Explore Annapurna Base camp and Hike back to Dovan

Day 8: Hike back to Jhinu Dada and enjoy Natural Hot spring

Day 9: Hike back to Siwai and drive to Pokhara

Day 10: Pokhara to Kathmandu Drive/Flight

This is the best possible itinerary to reach Annapurna Base camp. You can choose other destinations in Annapurna Region like Poon hill Trek, Ghandruk Trek, Lo manthang exploration, Tilicho Lake Trek and many other regions depending upon your preference, for shorter treks.

Early morning drive to Sarangkot for Sunrise view, back to hotel for Breakfast and visit Peace Pagoda, Mountain Museum and enrol in one of the adventure activities in Pokhara

#### Day 5: Pokhara to Lumbini Drive/Flight

This day after the breakfast we will drive towards the land of Buddha, Lumbini the city full of Peace and Harmony where the Light of Asia was Born. Evening sightseeing to Peace Stupa.

# Day 6: Lumbini Exploration

Begin your journey at the Maya Devi Temple, Explore the Lumbini Monastic Zone, filled with intricately designed monasteries and temples representing diverse Buddhist communities. visit to the sacred Puskarini pond. As the day winds down, enjoy the peaceful surroundings and witness a serene sunset, leaving you with a profound spiritual experience.





# Day 7: Lumbini to Kathmandu Drive/Flight

On Day 7, you'll embark on a 6 to 8-hour drive from Lumbini to Kathmandu. The journey will take you through picturesque landscapes, showcasing Nepal's countryside and rural life. Reach Kathmandu by evening and visit the Thamel Market.

Next day you can depart from Kathmandu or extend your stay via adding places like Bandipur, Chitwan and Nagarkot to explore out more on your travel in Nepal.



# HOW TO REACH?

Anyone from anywhere in the world can reach Nepal using various modes of transportation, including air and land. Waterways, although the last option is less common due to Nepal being a landlocked country.

**By Air:** Tribhuvan International Airport (TIA) in Kathmandu is the main international airport in Nepal, in the near future two more international Airports; Pokhara and Gautam Buddha International Airport are ready to serve you in Nepal, so make sure to inquire before your travel date. It serves as the primary gateway for travelers from around the world. Here's how reaching Nepal by air typically works:

**Flights:** Various international airlines operate flights to Tribhuvan International Airport (TIA) from major cities across the globe. These flights connect major hubs like Dubai, Doha, Delhi, Bangkok, Singapore, Kuala Lumpur, Istanbul, and more to Kathmandu. Travelers can book direct flights or connect through one of these hubs.

**Visa and Immigration:** Upon arrival at TIA, travelers are required to go through immigration procedures. Depending on your nationality, you might need a visa to enter Nepal. Some nationalities can obtain a visa on arrival. Also if you do not want any hassle in the airport then you can also apply before your arrival online from https://nepaliport.immigration.gov.np/online

**Customs:** After clearing immigration, travelers proceed to the customs area. It's important to declare any items that need to be declared and adhere to the customs regulations of Nepal.

<u>By Land:</u> Nepal shares its borders with India and China (Tibet). Travelers can enter Nepal from these countries by road through established border crossings. Here's how reaching Nepal by land typically works: **From India:** 

**Kakarbhitta:** This border crossing is in the eastern part of Nepal, connecting to the town of Siliguri in the Indian state of West Bengal.
